There are some very nice youngsters coming through, which is lovely to see! All dogs were presented in a clean, healthy condition, on the whole were in super coat and all had correct scissor bite. There were a small number of dogs with larger ears, flatter feet, high tail set or erratic movement, and a couple with very long nails, this alters the shape of the foot and therefore their movement and is detrimental to their future health.

Even at this age he has strength of head, neat ears, good fill under his almond shaped eye, good angulations front and rear, correct rise over the loin.
